



WANT TO GET A GREEN LIGHT?

Many intersections can detect bicycles and trigger the traffic light to turn green. Some intersections have bicycle traffic lights like the one pictured to the left. To get a green light when on your bike, follow the steps below.

When approaching a traffic light on your bike...

- 1 If you see a logo of a bike, place your bicycle directly over the logo, and then wait to get a green.

Place bike wheels on the line.



- 2 At some intersections without bicycle detection, there is a button nearby to push to trigger the traffic light to change.



- 3 Always stop and wait at red lights until they turn green. It's the law.



What to Know if You're Driving a Car

When you're sharing the road with a person biking, remember:

- Always use your turn signals so other people on the road know your next move.
- The law allows people to bike in the middle of the lane if needed.
- The law requires people driving to give at least 3 feet of space when passing people on bikes.
- Wait behind people on bikes when making a right turn. Don't turn right in front of a bicyclist.
- Don't honk at people biking. You might startle them and cause a crash.
